Revised Guidelines for payment of Honorarium to Registered Indigenous Priest.

In supersession of the guidelines issued earlier vide No. DIA-14013(12)/3/2021, dated 16th December' 2021, the revised guidelines for payment of honorarium to Registered Indigenous Priest(s) is hereby issued as under: -

- 1. He / she must be an Arunachal Pradesh Scheduled Tribe
- 2. He / she must practice as an Indigenous priest following own traditions, customs and culture etc.
- 3. He / she must be recognized and certified by the HGB/GPM and CO, EAC, ADC or DC of respective jurisdiction as priest.
- 4. Priest(s) of Nyedar Namlo, Gangging, Medar Nello, Kargu Gamgi, Donyi Polo Namlo, Donyi Polo Kumko, Rangfrah, Amik Matai, Nani Intaya, Nizeno etc. are entitled to get honorarium.
- 5. The Government of Arunachal Pradesh may provide honorarium to all the registered / approved priest.
- 6. The priest shall have to apply in prescribed format for registration which should be duly recommended by GB/ PRI members and District Administration.
- 7. The application received from the District Administration shall be verified by the Board at State level.
- 8. The verified / recommended priest(s) list shall be submitted to the Government for approval.
- 9. Only approved priest is eligible to receive honorarium from the Government.
- 10. The Priest who are convicted by the court for any criminal offences are not eligible for honorarium.
- 11. If any Priest converts into any other religion, he /she will lose the entitlement of honorarium.
- 12. The Monks (Lamas) Pundits, Father/ Nuns and Imams etc. are not entitled to get priest honorarium.
- 13. After the death/expiry of Priests, the honorarium shall be automatically ceased.
